SFISD HS Graduation Traffic and Parking

As we prepare to celebrate the Class of 2019, we wanted to share with you some important information.

Parking

Parking passes will be issued to all 2019 graduates by high school administration. Students taking part in graduation exercises received their parking passes during Senior checkout.

All vehicles must enter the high school grounds through the west student entrance on Highway 6. Officers will be on hand to direct traffic before and after the ceremony.

Prior to 6:30 p.m.

Parking at Santa Fe High School will be limited to parking passes only, as issued to 2019 graduates by high school administration. Vehicles displaying handicapped license plates or handicapped placards will also be permitted. An additional 90 parking spaces have been reserved for handicapped vehicles.

After 6:30 p.m.

General public will be permitted to park in the Santa Fe High School lot on a first come, first served basis until the lot is full. Once the main lot is full, visitors are encouraged to utilize the complimentary shuttle service from Santa Fe Junior High School. Upon the ceremonies conclusion, vehicles will be allowed to exit the west front student entrance, the traffic controlled intersection on Highway 6, and the rear drive. Traffic exiting the rear drive, will be directed down Maple Street towards North Elm.

Drop Offs/Pick ups

Vehicles dropping off and picking up passengers and not parking are asked to enter the front east drive (tear drop) and drop off in front of the school's main entrance. Vehicles will be directed out of the controlled intersection, back onto Highway 6.

Golf carts will be available in the parking lot to assist those visitors with special needs in getting from their vehicles to the stadium.

Shuttle Bus Service

Shuttle bus service will be available from Santa Fe Junior High School beginning at 5 pm., and will continue until no longer needed. Handicapped transport for those visitors with wheelchairs and special needs will also be available.

Media

There will be a designated area for media to assemble. The District is requesting that media attending the graduation ceremonies remain in this designated area for the duration of the graduation program. We ask that they refrain from approaching students and their families for interviews as they make their way into and out of the graduation ceremonies so that our students, staff and families are able to celebrate this wonderful milestone with minimal interruption.


