National Police Week

Santa Fe Independent School District National Police Week Proclamation

Whereas, there are 11 full time, 9 part time law enforcement officers, 6 security assistants, 2 crossing guards, and 1 dispatcher serving in Santa Fe ISD

Whereas, nearly 60,000 assaults against law enforcement officers are reported each year, resulting in approximately 16,000 injuries;

Whereas, since the first recorded death in 1791, more than 20,000 law enforcement officers in the United States have made the ultimate sacrifice and been killed in the line of duty;

Whereas, the names of these dedicated public servants are engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C.;

Whereas, the service and sacrifice of all officers killed in the line of duty will be honored during the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund's 32nd Annual Candlelight Vigil, on the evening of May 13, 2020;

Whereas, May 13, 2020 is designated as Peace Officers Memorial Day, in honor of all fallen officers and their families and U.S. flags should be flown at half-staff;

Therefore, Be It Resolved that Santa Fe ISD Board of Trustees formally designates May 10-16, 2020, as Police Week in Santa Fe ISD, and publicly salutes the service of law enforcement officers in our community and in communities across the nation.
