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
What is a Campus Compact?

FOCUS AREA #1

Counselors will meet individually with each senior to determine future goals and to ensure preparation after SFHS.

We will work with all stakeholders to ensure that our children are achieving their highest potential in college and career readiness. We will regularly check grades to monitor student progress and achievement. We will schedule conferences with all stakeholders when necessary.

We will dedicate time to exploring postsecondary options, including colleges and careers. We will work with our counselors to set short and long-term goals.
